Schedule

Privileges

1. The privileges afforded by this certificate of recognition may only be exercised by **JAMES GRAY NOLAN** (the holder) and relate only to the assigned categories listed in this document (as further specified in the Surveyor Recognition Framework published on the Maritime New Zealand website). The privileges afforded are to:
 - a) Undertake surveys or inspections or design approvals, in accordance with assigned categories, as provided for by maritime rules and marine protection rules.
 - b) Issue certificates and reports as applicable to the assigned categories as provided for by maritime rules and marine protection rules.

Standards and requirements of surveyors

2. When exercising the privileges of a Certificate of Surveyor Recognition, the holder must comply with the standards and requirements of surveyors included in Maritime Rule 44.

Conditions

3. The holder must not exceed the privileges set out in this Schedule.
4. When undertaking a survey, inspection, examination or design approval or making a declaration, the holder of this certificate must comply with any requirements as to the performance of surveys imposed by the Director.
5. The holder must continue to meet the fit and proper person criteria under the Maritime Transport Act 1994.
6. The privileges of this document must not be exercised by the holder of this certificate of recognition in respect of any ship in which the holder has a personal or financial interest.
7. No survey or design approval or inspection may be conducted by the holder of this certificate of recognition in respect of any ship in which the holder has undertaken, participated or completed design of hull, superstructure or machinery or shafting or fittings or electric systems or radio installation.
8. The findings of each survey conducted by the holder must be recorded and certified by the holder in a form acceptable to the Director.
9. No design approval or survey findings may be recorded and certified by the holder unless the holder has personally undertaken the survey or design approval.
10. The findings of each survey conducted by the holder must be reported to the Director and maritime transport operator concerned as soon as practicable (not later than two weeks after the completion of the survey or design report unless agreed by all parties).
